

Scholarship Background: The ArtBridge Fellowship provides educational and professional support to emerging artists from Washington State. Stipends may be used towards course work, supplies, and studio rental (with completion of rental test) and participation in Artist Trust's EDGE Program. The Fellowship includes educational experiences including gaining technical expertise, professional training, access to equipment, and an opportunity to engage with Pratt's artistic community.

Award Description:

Four awards will be given in the amount of \$2500. In addition, a studio supply stipend of \$1000 will be awarded to each participant. Professional photography (up to \$275) Participation in Artist Trust's EDGE program will be a part of this award at no extra cost to the recipient. The fellowship will culminate in a public component, including an exhibition of present work and discussion of accomplishments while in residence at Pratt.

Eligibility: This scholarship will be awarded to an emerging visual artist (18 years and above) who demonstrates artistic merit. Pratt board members and their families, as well as Pratt staff are not eligible to apply. Instructors are eligible. Up to two Pratt scholarships can be awarded to any given individual during his or her lifetime. A jury of artists and arts professionals will select the recipient.

Application: All applications must include a typewritten project proposal, not to exceed one page, explaining:

- What you intend to accomplish during the scholarship year
- How your proposal relates to your previous experience
- How this scholarship could enhance your artistic development and goals

Also include:

- Up to 6 images (see guidelines) of current work, each labeled with a number and ordered as you wish to have them viewed. Also include your name and the title of each piece.
- An image list, including the title of the piece, its dimensions, medium, and the year it was produced. Please note that Pratt may use your images for promotional purposes. If applying for more than one scholarship, only one set of images is required
- A current resume or brief biography
- A completed scholarship application form
- 3 copies of entire application
- Pratt can not be responsible for the return of materials submitted

Deadline: Applications are due July 1, 2009. The scholarship recipient will be announced in August 2009. For more information, please email: tfugami@pratt.org. Application packets should be addressed to:
