Jewelry & Metalsmithing Studios

Pratt's jewelry and metalsmithing studio has the most extensive array of hand tools and equipment of any rentable jewelry studio in Seattle. The studio includes space and equipment for renters to fabricate, cast, enamel and work in the company of other artists.

Glass Studios

Pratt's extensive studios provide the tools, equipment and space for creating in glass at an affordable price. Studio renters have access to Pratt's hot shop, cold shop, flameworking studio, flat glass studio and more.

Sculpture Studios

Pratt has the only publicly rentable sculpture studio in the Northwest with so much equipment under one roof. Renters have access to equipment and workspace for casting, sandblasting, metal fabricating, forging, moldmaking, stonecarving and more.
